### **Statement & General Terms for Public Safety and Disabled People**

The yellow days on the above calendar are our "high season" days, during high season we experience an increased amount of customers, the Bank Holidays and some periods throughout the School holidays throughout summer are the busiest periods for us. As a result, movement throughout the park can become challenging. Expect the park to be much busier during this time and please take this into consideration when planning your visit with us. If you are ever unsure, please feel free to contact Adventure Island customer service.

Some of our rides are physically demanding and vigorous. All visitors are invited to discuss the abilities required to use the rides safely and the possibility for reasonable adjustment. If, after considering all reasonable adjustments the risks identified to all visitors cannot be overcome, the company reserves the right to refuse admission to certain rides on the grounds of an individual's safety, enjoyment and wellbeing.

#### Not all rides will be suitable for all guests

We have been advised that refusal on the grounds of Health and Safety does not constitute discrimination in any way.

We hope that you understand and accept the decisions made in the interest of your safety and the safety of others.

This guide will assist our guests with disabilities to ensure that they have a safe and fun day out. We want all our guests to get the most out their visit to Adventure Island and enjoy as many of our rides and facilities as possible.

This guide has been produced to give you a full and realistic picture of our attractions, detailing issues, ride restrictions, details of ride evacuations and the requirements for helpers/carers to accompany guests.

Hopefully this, along with general ride restrictions detailed on signage at the rides, will enable you to assess your own abilities and make an informed decision about which attractions you are able to, or wish to use.

#### Parking

Adventure Island does not have any kind of parking for visiting guests. However, there is a large drop off point very close to the park's main west entrance. There are also public parking spaces along the seafront and many large car parks close by with lift and slope facilities. Please note, all public parking is managed by Southend Borough Council.

There are plenty of pay & display car parks in Southend with designated parking for those with a disability:

#### **Royal Shopping Centre**

Covered, multi-story parking adjacent to Park Inn hotel. Pay on return charges apply.

#### **Street Parking**

Town Centre and seafront parking is available. Pay & Display charges apply with free parking after 9pm.

#### Don't forget to display a valid blue badge in your vehicle.

If you have a disabled parking badge, there are adequate provisions provided outside our park within a short distance of all our main entrance points.

#### Entrance/Exits

The West, East and Adventure Golf entry points offer slopes. There are no turnstiles to enter the park. The slopes coming into the park are above a 10% gradient so it is recommended that a carer assist with entry and exit.

Entry/Exit via Adventure Inside is via stairs or an access lift.

Our West Entrance is also our delivery entrance and there are 2 bollards within the centre to prevent any vehicles from driving down within open hours. It is however wide enough for wheelchair access.

Entrance Gates are closed in a staggered manner in the interest of Health and Safety and Crowd Management, starting approximately 30 minutes before the park closes, the order is as follows:

- Adventure Golf Entrance Closes 30 minutes before park
- East Entrance (opposite Rage) Closes 20 minutes before park
- Adventure Inside Closes 15 minutes before park
- Three Shells Entrance Closes once the final guests have exited the park.

All of the above times are approximate, and we would advise guests with mobility impairment to take the above into consideration when planning their visit. If there are any concerns or queries, please feel free to contact Adventure Island customer service. Please note, these timeframes can change under the discretion of management.

#### **Ticket and Wristband Sales**

There are three main ticket and wristband purchase points, one located East of the Park (opposite Rage), one located on the West (opposite Crooked House) and one within Adventure Inside. Whilst all are wheelchair accessible, the West Ticket Box is also where

Customer Services is located, should you require further assistance. If required, Customer Services and Adventure Inside have hearing loop facilities.

#### **Carer policy**

The park's current policy on wristband sales for disabilities entitles the carer to a wristband of equivalent value for half price of the in-park rate. Please note that carers must be over the age of 16 to be responsible for anyone they wish to accompany, assist and care for. We do not currently have any concessions for carers when purchasing our individual tickets.

Guests may have two carers per person. The carer's wristband entitles the wearer access to rides only when accompanying the person being cared for. If the individual does require two carers, if the ride has 2 seater cars, the second carer can sit behind the person they're caring for.

We also offer a carer's Annual Pass. The Annual Pass will be assigned to the person that needs assistance and then different carers can accompany them on separate visits. The carer's pass can only be used to accompany the person with the disability, and cannot be used independently. Please note that only one wristband will be issued per annual pass per day. You can purchase up to 2 carer annual passes per person who requires the carer. The carer's Annual Pass is half price of the Adventure Island Annual Pass price.

The below can be used as documentation to obtain a carers wristband or Annual Pass:

- A headed NHS diagnosis letter.
- A letter from the DWP, DLA or PIP.
- A DID card.
- A valid Access Pass

#### **Attractions and facilities**

#### Wheelchairs

All wheelchair users must provide their own assistant. Wheelchairs can be obtained locally from Southend Tourist Information Centre. Advanced notice is required and you can book by calling 01702 215120. (Subject to availability).

Any wheelchairs we have on site, are for emergency situations only and cannot be borrowed or used unless in such a situation.

#### **First Aid**

The First Aid Station is located at the far west of the park by the Helter Skelter. There is also a secondary first aid post located within Adventure Inside for more minor first aid situations.

If you require first aid, please contact any member of staff, Customer Services or one of our Safe and Secure team who are located throughout the park and clearly identified by their uniform. We do have many staff who have been put through rigorous first aid training, however mainly members of our Safe and Secure team attend or perform first aid once requested.

#### Toilets

All of our toilets have a disabled facility. They are located on the far east of the park by the Dining-Saurs Cafe, in the centre of the park by the East entrance slope (next to the Green Scream Roller Coaster), in Adventure Inside (just next to our Play Stack entrance) and also at the far west of the park. All toilet facilities have automatic taps. There are also baby changing units provided at all three sites. Please see the park map for further reference to locations.

#### Telephone

There are pay phones located outside the park at the west entrance and also situated between the golf and east entrance.

Unfortunately we are unable to charge any mobile phones and do not have any charging stations within the grounds.

#### Arcades

There are two arcades. The Mega City Arcade is located on the west side of the park and the Funtopia Arcade is located centrally by the East side ticket box and under the restaurant Feelgoods. Both are wheelchair accessible and amenable. Assistance dogs are welcome, subject to leads and harnesses. The arcades are both well illuminated and have permanent assistance available as they are fully staffed at all times. #### **Restaurants and Shops**

The two main on-site restaurants are the Dining-Saurs Cafe and Feelgoods Diner. Both are wheelchair accessible although the Dining-Saurs Café has dim lighting for effect, Feelgoods may be the preferred option for those with visual impairments. Assistance dogs are permitted.

There are several other catering outlets offering healthy choices as well as fast food options. All are considered wheelchair accessible. Please note, there is a small step up by The Eatery.

Sands by the Sea, The Pavilion and the Three Shells Café are wheelchair accessible and have slopes should you require them.

All Shops and Retail Outlets are wheelchair accessible, in well illuminated areas with staff on hand to assist.

Our Gift shop does have dimmed lighting and can be slightly darker in the evenings. There are staff permanently in this area should a guest require assistance.

### **Ride access and queuing**

#### **Ride Access**

We are unable to provide helper/companion facilities to gain access to or from rides and therefore all wheelchair users must provide their own carers, although we will assist where it is safe to do so. In cases where guests do require a carer, we do provide a half price wristband for helpers/companions on a one to one or two to one basis. Your helper/companion will be expected to assist you for the duration of your visit, including lifting to gain access to rides where required. That person must also be able to assist in the event of a ride evacuation. This person must be at least 16 years of age.

If you either use a wheelchair or have artificial limbs you must study the rides and consider our recommendations. Please also make your own informed choice based on your own disability or injury before deciding to ride. Expectant mothers, those with neck, back or heart conditions and those who have had recent surgery or an injury should also study the rides before choosing to ride.

We have been advised that declining a guest access to rides for their own and others Health and Safety is not discrimination. With this being said, some guests who have had amputations may not be granted access to certain rides do to the harness or locking mechanisms.

Rides are governed by height restrictions, any of our admissions desks can measure and issue guests with a stamp explaining what rides each guest can access. Not all rides will be suitable depending on your type of disability and information boards can only advise you. Our height restrictions range from no minimum to 130cm in height and 10 years old. Certain rides have a maximum height limit but all rides have a minimum height requirement.

Please do not ask our ride hosts to assist in lifting in any way or to break strict ride codes; they are in place for everyone's safety. In addition to the ride information boards, we strongly suggest you observe the rides in motion before making your decision whether to ride. We are a Free Admission Theme Park and welcome guests to have a look around and see what is suitable before buying a wristband or tickets. #### Queue assist policy

We welcome visits from guests with disabilities and will do everything possible to ensure they have a safe and pleasurable visit and are able to participate in as many activities as possible. There is a queue assist scheme for any visitor who requires assistance, although there is no fast track system in operation within the park. Any guest who requires assistance for whatever reason, whether they are unable to understand the concept of queuing or have a disability, are asked to wait with either a carer in the queue and the guest nearby or both queue normally. If for any reason this is not possible we will allow both the guest and carer to wait at the exit. The ride operator then has the discretion to allow them to access the ride at an appropriate time, when it is seen to be fair to the other guests who have queued. Once allowing them to enter, we will direct the person requiring assistance and carer to the seats closest to the exit and continue to load the ride. We can also issue a ride access sheet for those who require a carer, or cannot queue in our main queues due to a disability. This is in place for when our ride queues are longer than expected. Our Ride Operators can issue the guests with a time to return to the exit of the ride, in order to avoid a long wait. This is under the discretion of the ride operator.

#### Guest and carer:

If a guest over 120cm tall, requires a carer to ride with them, they can purchase the carers band with the presentation of the documentation as discussed in our carers policy.

If a carer band is purchased by any party, the admissions team are to give them an access sheet, to avoid stressful queueing.

The guest and the carer accompanying them, or just the carer can head to the exit of the ride to see if they are able to ride shortly, if to see if the ride operator will give them a time frame to return to the exit.

Please note, the access sheet does not apply to Tidal Wave or The Helter Skelter.

#### Under 120cm:

If there is a child who is under 120cm tall but does require a carer, they do not need to purchase a carers band, as the under 120cm rule still applies.

If the guests do mention any form of reason as to why they cannot queue in the main queue for any reason, the admissions team are to give them an access sheet, to avoid stressful queueing.

The child and the adult going to accompany them, or just the adult can head to the exit of the ride to see if they are able to ride shortly, if to see if the ride operator will give them a time frame to return to the exit.

Please ensure to follow the Time Allocation Procedure as stated on the Access Sheet. For more information please feel free to contact our customer service team at <u>enquiries@Stockvale.co.uk</u> or 01702 443400

#### Lone adult:

If there is an adult who cannot queue for any reason<u>due to disability</u>, but does not feel they require a carer on the rides, they are to be given an access sheet at the admissions desks. The guests do need to mention this to the admissions team to ensure this is handed over.

The adult with the access sheet is the only person who can head to the exit of the ride, to avoid large groups as there is no carer.

The adult can head to the exit of the ride to see if they are able to ride shortly, if to see if the ride operator will give them a time frame to return to the exit.

#### <u>Tickets:</u>

While we do not currently have any concessions for any carers when purchasing individual ride tickets, we do still offer the access sheet if guests cannot queue for any reason.

If the guests do mention any form of reason as to why they cannot queue in the main queue for any reason and are purchasing multiple tickets, the admissions team are to give them an access sheet, to avoid stressful queueing.

The individual and the carer accompanying them, or just the carer can head to the exit of the ride to see if they are able to ride shortly, if to see if the ride operator will give them a time frame to return to the exit.

If the guests are asked to return, they are to keep hold of their tickets until they return to the ride.

If the guests are purchasing individual tickets for one or two rides, please inform the guests that they are able to head up the exit of the ride and wait accordingly.

The ride operator will place a mental marker in the queue if they are able to and will allow the guests to ride accordingly.

If for any reason the ride operators cannot place a mental marker in the queue for the guests, they are to contact their zone leader.

Please note, the access sheet does not apply to Tidal Wave or The Helter Skelter.

Please note, there are some rides where this system is not physically possible. This being the Tidal Wave Blue, the Tidal Wave Green and the Light House Slide.

Some guests because of their particular disability may require more than one carer to accompany them to ensure safety. In these circumstances the second carer can ride alone and sit behind the first carer and the disabled person. We also provide half price wrist bands for carers as a concession.

For reasons of ride balancing and evacuation procedures, the number of disabled guests on certain rides at any one time may be restricted. If you are in a large group, it may be advisable to separate into smaller numbers.

In certain situations (such as extreme weather conditions, mechanical problems or power interruptions) it may be necessary for riders to be evacuated from a ride, possibly from the highest point. Please refer to the individual ride recommendations to see what this involves.

Any time frames are at the discretion of the ride operator on the ride at the time and unless stated otherwise, guests cannot access the ride earlier that this designated time. If guests do arrive less than 20 minutes later than the allocated timeframe, the ride operators are to allow the guests access to the ride on the next cycle. If guests do arrive more than 20 minutes later than the ride operator cannot honour this and a new timeslot will be allocated.

Please note, the access sheet does not apply to Tidal Wave or The Helter Skelter.

Please note that safety to all staff and visitors is of paramount importance to us and we will endeavour to make your visit as pleasurable as possible. However, some rides regrettably may be considered inadaptable for your needs. We have an ongoing maintenance programme and will make adaptations where possible, as soon as it is possible.
